Course Descriptions for 2022-2023

Hands-on Cultures: Five to seven year olds will spend the year delving into cultures in the Eastern Hemisphere. First, where in the world are we? Then, where is India? Australia? France? Ghana? Who lives there? What do they eat? What do they wear? Through read-alouds and hands-on activities, the students will get a taste of life in faraway places. They'll think about how geography and natural resources shape the way people live. They'll create art, eat food, and play games common to each culture. They'll gain a sense of their place in a world of diverse people that God loves...and have a lot of fun doing it!

Hands-on History—Early American Heroes: Seven to nine year olds will use the lives of famous Americans as a springboard to exploring the history of America from its earliest days. From Pocahontas to Paul Revere, from Squanto to Benjamin Franklin, students will learn fascinating stories about the diverse people that are a part of our nation's history. As with all our Deerstream classes, each morning will be full of art, hands- on projects, beautiful read-alouds, and memorable activities to make history come alive.

North Carolina Studies: Nine to eleven year olds will study North Carolina. Zooming in for an up-close perspective, they'll learn about the geography, history, government, and culture of our state. They'll take a look at the landforms, famous people, important events, governmental structure, economic activities, and amazing people that make North Carolina unique and wonderful. Through map work, art work, drama, projects, research, read alouds, and more, their studies will be lively and thoughtful.
